

Listening For....



This week at one of our gatherings, the question was asked 'What skill do you think you are growing in'? I don't know what you would have answered to that question?

You could have said a hobby, a sport, a musical skill, or almost anything. For me the skill I am learning, or perhaps the understanding I am gaining, is that pausing to listen makes for better understanding and means if I do say something next, it is more likely to be worth hearing. Taking that deliberate pause when someone else has finished speaking to reflect, to be still, to go further than just hearing and really listen makes a world of difference. So often we can find ourselves hearing in order to respond. But listening to understand takes us to a much deeper relational understanding of one another.

Listening seems very much to be what is missing in our world. I have just driven home listening to Israelis, Palestinians, and other commentators try and make sense of what is going on in Gaza. It was evident in the conversation that not only is listening to understand, not happening; but also, different groups are seeing the same reality in different ways. Perhaps there is something to learn about how, when we really listen, what we see can be changed too.

Recently, students from one of the local primary schools came to my other church and we thought together about hearing God. There are many and varied ways people have heard God both in the **B**ible and since then; from Joseph's dreams, to John's visions, to Samuel hearing God guide him in circumstances around him, to the Bible being God's word that is brought alive to us as God uses it to speak into our lives. In one way or another God is always speaking, but what is common to all these examples, is pausing.



God's voice is often easiest to hear at particular moments in life when the circumstances turn down volume of the ordinary, and the real questions seem to bubble up. This can be in our teenage years, when we have children, when trauma hits, when challenges come, or when we feel we are reaching the twilight of our lives. But it need not be just circumstances that cause us to pause long enough to listen for God. With some effort and intentionality, we can choose to turn that volume down ourselves.

Tools to help us can be meditation on parts of the Bible, worship music, or simply putting away the phone, the tablet, the TV and making an appointment with yourself to be still. It is in those moments He can be heard and from that oasis in our week we can draw truth, light, and the strength to listen to others and show their worth.

So perhaps this month like me, you will find renewed pleasure in listening both to God and each other; pausing before responding and finding again the joy of being still and knowing you are heard by the one who loves you.

News from African Pastors Fellowship

Delegates arriving for a recent APF conference announced: "Thank God for Google Maps!" The couple had travelled 20km within the Kampala metropolitan area and had found the venue with digital assistance.

In nearly 20 years travelling the length and breadth of east Africa – on tarmac highways, maram roads, dusty tracks and dodging potholes, I've never seen my driver refer to a roadmap or atlas for directions. I've been lost in urban centres and sugar cane plantations, I've broken down 'deep in the village' and deep in the Rift Valley ... but finding the route or assistance was always social, accompanied by smiles and arm waving: "just branch at the big tree and continue ..." And we always reached our destination, sometimes several hours late, but we got there! It is significant that Africans now prefer a digital solution over asking their neighbour. Africa is changing, the change is rapid, and these changes have implications for mission and ministry: how is APF responding?

Digital Tools Little did we know when we launched eVitabu that a pandemic was coming that would accelerate the use of digital solutions to enable communication, training and church online. eVitabu continues to position APF ahead of the curve in terms of a digital tool that resources African pastors across the continent and reaches an estimated 1.5m believers with contextualised gospel resources.

Digital Training Having a device is one thing, using it effectively is another. At a Church of Uganda clergy conference in June the need to support pastors to utilise their Smartphone, being up-skilled to make use of office software, protect themselves and others online or develop a digital strategy was identified.

Digital Theology We are all being shaped by technology. How does this impact our understanding of who we are in Christ? What does this mean for our sense of belonging to the Body of Christ? How can we share the love of Christ with our neighbours both physically and digitally?

Thank God for Google Maps? Maybe. What is certain, Africa is changing as the internet becomes 'embedded, embodied and everyday' across the continent. And APF is uniquely well placed to seize the moment and continue its pioneering ministry to enable effective ministry in the digital age.
