## The Dawn is Coming

The night is darkest just before dawn, I promise you, the dawn is coming Easter remembers both the darkest of times and the brightest of times. The darkness first.

It was a few years ago speaking to my cousin who is a paramedic that I first came across the concept of people who assault ambulance crews. When I first heard it, it just did not compute. Why would people in need of help try to harm the very people sent to provide that help? It would be like awaiting rescue on a sinking boat and using your last torpedo to shoot at the lifeboat on it's way to rescue you.

#### Oddly that is what happened at Easter.

The Bible tells us that God absolutely loves humanity, all of us. But that our mistakes, wrong actions and thoughts had formed a barrier between us and God. This was not something God wanted and so He looked for a way to remove it, and the only way was for Him to come, to live as one of us; and to die in our place so we could be forgiven, the barrier removed. We see this theme time and again in films, stories, and books; from Transformers, the Matrix, Braveheart, Armageddon, Lord of the Rings, Harry Potter.. and the list goes on. The idea of a character losing their life to save many is deeply embedded in us somehow; I would say because it echoes the story of the whole of history; Jesus is God come as a man, who died to remove the barrier so we could be free and know God for ourselves.

On Good Friday, we remember the darkness; where humanity killed the one sent to rescue us.

But on Easter Sunday we remember that the dawn came.

We remember that the darkness did not win, and that even in that moment of darkness; God was working a miracle. He was opening the door for us to know Him and to find purpose and happiness, forgiveness, and a life that will not end when our bodies end. The Bible ends with the ultimate dawn. It explains that one day we will meet God and there will be no more need of the sun, for we will live by the light of God. The dawn will have brightened into the brightest of lights.

The account of Easter is full of darkness, and light; but also choices. The crowds shouted for Jesus to save himself, and He could have got down from the cross and walked away. But because of His love for us, His desire to remove the barrier, He didn't. We see the choice of one of the soldiers at His death to recognise that Jesus really was God.

And the whole account begs the question; what will we make of Jesus? For me, I know I needed a rescuer, and perhaps you do too. Someone to give me hope, a new life, a new purpose, to forgive me my mistakes, and walk with me daily. It's an offer open to each of us. An offer you might want to contact the church about exploring for yourself.

So have a great easter and I hope you enjoy celebrating the dawn that followed the darkness.
