Anne Rolfe

Tell us a bit about your family and background

I was born in Bridlington, East Yorkshire and have a younger brother. We were brought up attending a Methodist church in the village where we lived. I trained in London as an Early Years/Primary teacher and have taught in Middlesbrough and Stillington. I moved to Teesside when I married Geoff in 1975.

We have two daughters, Kate and Jenny and three grandchildren. Kate lives in Australia and has two children and Jenny lives a bit closer in Sheffield and they have a son.

Do you remember the first time you came to All Saints. What made you come back?

The first time I came to All Saints was for a family service when Kate was in Brownies and was asked to attend Church Parade. I remember being welcomed by Brian Wake and feeling relaxed and at ease. I'd been worried that Church of England services might be very different from Methodist services and I might feel out of place. I needn't have worried. All Saints soon felt like 'home'. I started to come to family services once a month and took Jenny to Mums and Toddlers and made more friends from All Saints, many of whom are still friends today. I volunteered to help at a holiday club at All Saints and it was there that I experienced my first encounter with the Holy Spirit. During a children's worship song 'I'm special because God has loved me' I came to realise how special I was to God and that he cared about me. I was confirmed in my 30s at All Saints. I helped to run the Scramblers group (now called Gems), have led the pastoral team, have been part of the prayer ministry team and am presently helping to lead the team who deliver Connect lunch club.

What verse/passage of Scripture/prayer do you hang onto when times are tough?

Proverbs 3 v5.6 and Isaiah 40 v31. These passages talk about trusting in God, letting him guide you and give you strength and wisdom as you live for him.

I know that God has been with me through illness, bereavement but also in the joyful times of life. He has sent people to support and pray for me.

What do you do to relax?

I like meeting friends for coffee, gardening, going out for meals, walking and playing with my five year old grandson (maybe not so relaxing the last one!) Recently I felt that I needed to be more physically active so I've joined a gym and enjoy swimming. For my birthday Geoff bought me a ukulele. Learning to play it is my new challenge.

Thoughts as you start as Churchwarden?

Talking to Anne and Chris before being elected gave me some idea of what is involved but Anne said it would be fun so I'm looking forward to that! I know it may be challenging at times, but I also know that God will give me His strength and wisdom. So here I am leaning on God and on each one of you to help me. I have so much to thank God for and feel that this is one of the ways I can do that and also share His love. It is a real privilege to serve God at All Saints.

Stories from Mexico



Over Easter a team of our Young People and their leaders went to Mexico to build a home for a family living in poverty, some of the team have shared their thoughts after returning home:

Abi:

My highlights were: praying over the structure of the house with our hopes for the family; time spent as a team and handing the keys over to Justina one of members of the Zenovio family. It's taught me so much about God especially his heart for justice and for his people. For me Mexico has made me really grateful for what I have; seeing the reality of the conditions people live in and seeing their thankfulness for what they had, literally thanking God for everything. It's also left me with a longing for change, some of the things we witnessed were just not right and it broke my heart to see and it's challenged me to try and live differently, shopping sustainably, raising awareness and praying for injustice.

Thomas:

Mexico was a time to put my faith into action. I believe that God has called me to serve others and this trip has allowed me to live out this calling. I loved learning about the Mexican culture and seeing how God can make a difference through our lives. I have learned a lot from this trip. The families in Mexico have so little and yet thanked God for what they have. This trip has made me so grateful for what I have and has made me want to use this to help others.

Katherine:

The main thing that stood out to me was how positive the team were despite facing some extremely challenging things. This looked like singing at every opportunity (mainly Party In The USA), jokes galore and having so much fun around the campfire. My highlights? Playing bungalow!! Also spending time with some of the Americans on the campsite.

God was moving throughout us all that week, especially with prayer. Everyone was so God focused, and it really resonated with me as that was the entire purpose of the trip summed up perfectly. How the trip impacted my life? I'm going to implement some of the Mexican culture into my life by using everything I have until I can't anymore and try and shop preloved to not buy into the idea of fast fashion.


