What Is The Point Of A Church?

I have recently joined the Orchard Eagles Running Club (other clubs are available). If you are a member, I am the one who still can't run and speak so apologies for not having said hello. If not, they are a running club made up of lots of local people. And if you turned up to the running club and asked 'what is the purpose of the club?' you might get funny looks as it's pretty obvious- running. Similarly, if you rocked up at the golf club, the answer is pretty obvious; we are about golf. But for lots of people the purpose of the church is a bit of a mystery, so let me give you a little bit of food for thought:





Purpose 1: To do good in the community

This is right at the heart of what we are about at All Saints. Trying to do good, and in doing so for people to know they are valued and loved whether they come to church or not. Therefore, All Saints for example, supports over 30 children in developing countries to get an education, we run toddlers provision where we want to go further than providing space and toys but for those who come to know they are valued and loved. We run a lunch club for retired people (new members welcome), we run a café for those new to the country, we run a friendship group, mental health and wellbeing groups, and visit people in the community. Churches run most of the food banks across the UK. Because people matter to God and matter to the church.

Purpose 2: To point to the God who made us all.

One of the poems in the Bible says 'We are all wonderfully made'. Some days I don't feel like that. But the God who made me gave me value that is not dependent on me. And then He came as Jesus, to live and die, to open the door so I could be forgiven my mistakes and mess ups and be in relationship with Him. The church exists to point to God and to extend that invitation of friendship with Him that He meant for all people. To point to the fact that none of us are mistakes and that God is amazing and cares about each of us.





Purpose 3: Prayer.

I don't know if you love our bell that rings every Sunday at 9am. I hear back in the day it rang at 8am so there is something to be grateful for that it isn't so early any more! The reason for the bell is not to give people who are not at church a guilt trip. But instead, to remind the surrounding community that they are being prayed for, and that God answers prayer. I can tell you now that our prayers do not aim to be eloquent or use thee's and thou's. Like any request, it isn't the words that are important, but the person you are making it to. And our God loves all people, wants to be involved in our lives and invites all of us to talk to Him in prayer.

The final thing church is meant to be is family. Somewhere all people can be welcomed; can discover the gifts and abilities God gave them; and to be encouraged and supported with all God has led them to be involved with, in whatever is happening in the rest of life. Church then is hopefully the best of families, where we cheer each other on, and all know they are welcome. There is no membership test, and the only criteria for coming along is an awareness we all make mistakes. All are welcome.

So have a wonderful term ahead. If you see me running please don't take offence if I can't speak to you. And if you would like to find out more about our church family, just come along to any of the things going on. Everything is open to all.

Our Mission Partners

We have four main Mission partners at All Saints, each of whom we have been supporting for a number of years and who are also linked to Life Groups who support them with prayer and encouragement.



Carolyn Kemp was for many years the Director of the Diaspora Mission of OMF.

This involves discipling people from
East Asia who are studying or
working in other countries so that
they take the gospel with them
when they return home. She has
stepped down from that role and is
now involved in training those
working with and discipling those
who come to Jesus, for example in
UK, Kenya, Australia, USA and Korea.
The emphasis of Mission has indeed
become "Everywhere to
Everywhere"



Mark and Gill Newham, worked in Mongolia for 30 years and saw tremendous growth in the church there.

Mongolian missionaries are now going to other countries in Asia to spread the gospel. Mark and Gill have now returned to England and Mark has been asked to develop a team who will support missionaries working from many countries. For instance Africans who are reaching into the Muslim world. They say that Mission is no longer based on people going from England to other countries, but, from Everywhere to Everywhere.



Dave Stedman is the CEO of the African Pastors Fellowship.

Their main project over the last few years has been the launch and distribution of a digital resource for Pastors working in Africa called eVitabu. This mobile Library app has allowed access to a great many theological books and training aids to those working even in remote areas. It is currently being used in over 20 nations



Mark and Anna Burgess and their sons, Daniel, Joel and Kaleb, are living and working in Lima Peru.

They started a church there and another in the jungle. They have Children's projects ongoing and this year have appointed local pastors to lead the church in Lima. Mark is currently studying for an MA in Leadership, Mission and Ministry.

Most of you I'm sure will be aware of the Church of England's pledge to be Net Zero Carbon by 2030.

This is a significant challenge for all churches and will be a challenge for us at All Saints'. In 2023 as a church we emitted 21.7 Tonnes C02e which is a slight reduction on 2022 when we emitted 22.6 Tonnes C02e. Our carbon output puts us in the top 20% of emitters in the diocese, this is not unexpected as we use our church buildings 7 days most weeks and presents us with the challenge of how we can reduce our carbon output.

We have however already made lots of changes to our buildings over many years to help reduce our energy use and these include.

- Modern insulated church centre and narthex
- Double glazing to many of our windows
- Insulated the roof of the church building
- Modern efficient zoned heating system.
- Smart thermostats throughout the building
- Solar panels on the church centre roof.
- LED lighting in many areas

Our environment group and the PCC have already spent some time discussing how we can reduce our carbon output further and have produced an initial action plan which includes.

- Replacing main hall and foyer lights with LED fittings.
- Double glazing the remaining church windows.
- Increasing the number of solar panels, possibly with battery storage.
- Investigating low carbon heating options for the main hall heating.

How can you get involved?

We are planning to run a Carbon Literacy Course to help individuals understand their own carbon footprint, so look out for details in the coming months. You could perhaps join our environment or property teams as they look at making our buildings more energy efficient. Plus, everyone can help by turning lights off when they leave rooms and thinking about how they travel to church each week.


