Commended Carelessness

Back in 1215 when the Magna Carta was written, there began the idea of common land. It was a system to look out for those who had little to no money or income. In the UK over 1/3 of our moorland even today is common land including chunks of the Dales. So if you want to gather wood, graze your animals, or collect bracken for a bed, be my guest. That is your gift from the Magna Carta.





In the times of the Bible God commanded carelessness in harvesting for similar reasons. Those who owned the land were commanded to ensure that by the time they brought in the harvest, that there would be scraps left over; bits around the edges that they had deliberately missed. And the aim was that the poor could come along afterwards and be guaranteed some food. (We see the laws for this in Leviticus 23, and the book of Ruth gives us a good example of a family who benefitted).

In our world today a good question is, who does not have enough and what could be done? Perhaps your first thought is of people without food and so as well as giving to Food Banks, on October 13th on Harvest Sunday, we make a particular collection which is advertised on the coming pages. This is not only about giving, but recognising we have food because God has given us this wonderful world, so we are just passing on the blessing.



Of course there will be other ways too that we see people without the things they need. And so I am so grateful for those of you who volunteer and work in schools to coach young people in life skills; those of you who make time to visit those who might otherwise be lonely; those of you who work alongside men and women coming out of prison to help them make a great start to the next part of life; those of you who foster as a way to give a leg up to children who did not have a great start; and many more things.

All of this is that carefulness which ensures all are looked out for, all are cared for, because all people are loved and valued by our Heavenly Father. So far I have written as if all of us are those with things to give whether time, money, attention or whatever. But each of us too have seasons where we are not in that position. Sometimes it is hard to accept that switch of situation, and to receive, but that too is part of being community. So if you need someone to have a cuppa and a chat with, if you need prayer, if you would benefit from the financial advice we offer through the CAP money course, if you are struggling with mental health, or a million other things, do get in touch and we would be pleased to see how we can help.

Community is one of the greatest gifts God has given to us. To be there for one another in need and meeting need. At the end of September Kathryn Belmont will be leaving her role as All Saints' Youth Pastor, and she has been looking back on her time in the role:

It has been the greatest joy and privilege to serve as Youth Pastor at All Saints' for the past 15 years, spending my days encouraging young people in their relationship with Jesus.

Now however, after 15 years, it is time for a new season, and I will be starting my new role as 'Growing Younger Strategic Lead' at Durham Diocese on 7th October.

There have been so many highlights over the past 15 years. I started as Assistant Youth Pastor in 2009, when Tim Wye-Williams was the full-time Youth Pastor. He had a vision to employ a female Youth Pastor alongside himself. A church having two Youth Pastor's was incredibly rare at the time and the fact that our church supported this vision is a testament to the wonderful way that All Saints' has invested in the faith of young people for decades. Since then Tim has been a constant support and has shared so much wisdom with me, which I am so grateful for!

Other highlights include; numerous Summer camps, residentials and international mission trips to Mexico, Malawi and Dallas; launching a Teesside-wide youth service called 'Refresh'; many of our young people taking part in the Doulos leadership programme; starting a detached ministry to the skatepark, youth-led services, weekly Life Groups, Youth Club and Youth Church; Youth Alpha; Café Church, Four Weeks of Fun, boys and girls outreach groups and so much more!



Within all of this, the heart of our ministry has always been that 'we want young people to become life-long followers of Jesus', and we are consistently striving to make church a place where all young people feel at home, loved and valued.

Despite all of this, some of my most treasured moments have been 'smaller' ones. I have been privileged to mentor a number of young people, meeting with them regularly to talk about life and faith. I have never taken this for granted – that a young person would be authentic and honest with me about their biggest questions. We have opened the bible many times together, drank many Costa drinks, discussed how to go deeper with Jesus and prayed together many times. The moments when a young person brought me a question about the bible after church, when they asked me to pray for them, or came excitedly to tell me about a conversation they had with their friend about Jesus, have been some of my favourite things.

Of course none of this could have happened without our exceptional youth team. They give their time sacrificially, and care deeply about the faith of our young people. I have also been incredibly blessed to work with several Serve Team Volunteers, who have each brought their unique gifts, strengthening how we connect with young people. I could not be happier that Ruby Watson is our Serve Team Volunteer this year – God is doing brilliant things through her! My husband, John, has really gone above and beyond, spending his days teaching Maths to students, and then cycling to church multiple times a week to invest in the faith of the young people here (and turning up in fluorescent yellow, which as you can imagine always goes down well)! He has been with me through the highs and the lows and been the best support possible.

Now it is time for a new and exciting season for the youth ministry at All Saints'. I believe it will be a season of going for growth and not settling for what we already have. It will be a time of pioneering new things, whilst also giving real focus to excellent discipleship. It will also be a season of resourcing and encouraging other local churches to connect with young people.

For myself personally as I move on, my role will be about championing mission and ministry with 0-25s throughout Durham Diocese, an area that comprises of 209 PCC's, 234 licensed clergy and 57 Church of England schools across the North East. I would value your prayers so much as I take on this new challenge, and I would like to say a huge thank you for all of your support and encouragement throughout my time as Youth Pastor.
